- Kolping National will establish a grant program where Kolping families can submit local programs or projects designed to advance the ideals of Fr. Kolping and encourage new members. Funding may be available through the National Endowment.
- Kolping USA will continue to participate in the Lenten Project with Kolping Uganda soliciting donations for the goat program for the next two years (2019-2020). Kolping USA will match donations up to \$7500 per year.

Military Records

The rest of the time is spent one-on-one working with each other on capturing our information and expanding our skill sets. Bring a notepad and your research, and a laptop if you have one.

Our October topic is **Military Records**. Learn to search the major web sites, Ancestry and Fold3. Find out what an Official Military Personnel File (OMPF) is and how to search federal archives. Digital images of WWI draft registration cards are online at Ancestry.com, Findmypast.com and the [free FamilySearch.org](http://www.familysearch.org).

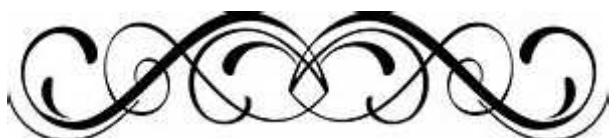
Deaths

Bill and Christine were Schützenfest King and Queen in 1984, and Bill was the recipient of the Cincinnati Kolping Meritorious Service Award, as well as the National Kolping Distinguished Service Award. We extend our sympathies to Bill's children, Billy, Steve & Tim Janszen, and Theresa Bamberger, as well as the entire Janszen family.

Gottfried Schlembach, husband of Josephine Schlembach, former Kolping member and longtime member of the Kolping Sängchor, passed away on September 1, 2018 at the age of 86. Gottfried lived at the Kolping House at 1523 Republic Street in Over-the-Rhine in the early 1950s when he first came to Cincinnati from Germany, and he also played soccer for the Kolping Soccer Team in those early days. 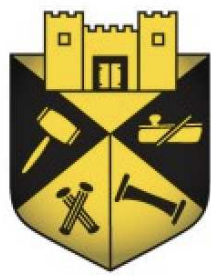
