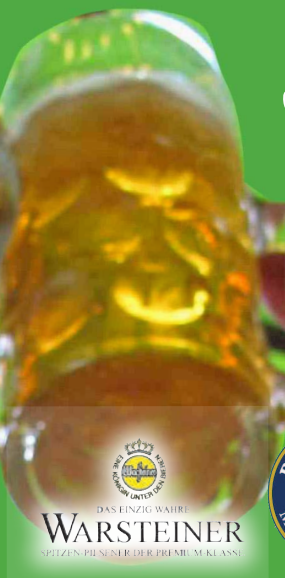

Since 1926, we at Kolping have been part of a great tradition, the crowning of our Schuetzen King and Queen.

Our Schützenfest is the longest running German festival in greater Cincinnati and we are blessed to have so many dedicated members step up and give freely of their time

and talents to represent our Kolping Society as our Schuetzen King and Queen.

As with many long running traditions there are always myths, misunderstandings and misconceptions. The following is a brief outline of the duties and expectations of the Schuetzen King and Queen. This memo is not to be construed as all encompassing; only as a reference for those interested in shooting for King.

The first and foremost responsibility is to represent Kolping; you are the Goodwill Ambassadors for the Society. You are expected to attend as many Kolping events as possible. Additionally you should attend the other German societies' events to represent and promote Kolping and our annual events. It is also customary to attend the Detroit Kolping King's Ball (April) and their Schützenfest (July).

The second responsibility is to assemble your court. The court will have a maximum of 40 couples, 5 of which are required; the Kolping president, the past King and Queen and the junior king's and queen's parents. The remaining 35 couples should be comprised of your friends and family with the majority being Kolping members. The selection of your court should not be taken lightly; these are the couples that will help you throughout the year. The court dues are set by the Board and are currently \$185.00 per couple (\$135.00 for the court fees & \$50.00 for the Kings Ball). The court fees (\$5,400.00) are your funds to be used for the court parties (food, alcohol, wine, champagne, music, court pins and decorations). All other purchases (King's medals, Trachten, dresses, hats, hotel rooms etc...) come from your personal funds. Recent Kings have spent as little as \$0.00 to a high of \$5,000.00 over and above the court fees and it is entirely up to your discretion.

The third responsibility is to host and plan the following events: Chairman's Party, Get Acquainted Party, Champagne Party, Parade Rehearsal, Queen's Party and The King's Party. At the King's Ball you are the guest of the Society, but you are responsible for promoting the Ball and decorating the Hall. Additionally, you will host a cocktail party in the clubhouse for your court, invited guests as well as the visitors from Detroit prior to the Grand Parade.

Your year as King will involve some hard work, but it will also be a rewarding and fun year as you celebrate your

reign with the Kolping Society and your friends. If you have any questions we have listed on the reverse side your greatest resource for a successful year, the past Kings.

Kings, Queens and Courts – A picture of the royal couple, a court picture, a list of court members and a picture of the king’s medal have been found for all courts back to 1960. Earlier than that, the information is sparse except for a few years.

We need to get in touch with the children or grandchildren of past kings, queens, presidents and other active members of the Society from long ago. Maybe some of these children and grandchildren still possess old pictures or other items related to the history. We have been successful in this regard when we made contact with Liz Wenker, the daughter of Ben Wenker, the first president and first king of the Society back in 1924 and 1925. The same happened when we located Rick Strecker, the son of David and Kathy Strecker, king and queen in 1957, as well as Marsha Glindmeyer Geraci, the daughter of Ralph and Dolores Glindmeyer, king and queen in 1981. We also look forward to a meeting in July with Mary Ann Rathman, daughter of George Birn, one of the founders of the Society, as well as king in 1948. The information is out there somewhere. It’s just a matter of finding the right people. If you personally know of any of the children or grandchildren of deceased members, please forward our contact information to them.

Did you or anyone in your family ever receive a **Kolping Service Award**, either locally and/or nationally? We would like to have pictures that were taken of the occasion.

And don’t forget about this important part of history – your own. Have you considered writing your memories of your association with the Kolping Society? The questions below are part of a form that we can e-mail to you or you can pick up a copy in the clubhouse, or we’ll send you a copy in the mail. Of course, you can also just write your thoughts on any paper and mail the paper to us. This kind of thing will make the book so much more personal and after all, what is Kolping but people! Try out some of these questions. **When did**

you join Kolping and why? How many generations of your family have been involved in Kolping? Their names? What are your earliest memories of Kolping? What are some of your favorite memories of Kolping? Did you belong to any sub-groups? If so, tell something about your involvement. What activities were you involved in? Any particular stories to tell regarding these activities? What offices or positions of leadership did you hold at Kolping? Which years? What did you enjoy most about Kolping? How has being a member of Kolping changed your life and/or made it better?

Some other matters - We need translation help with the many articles from 1928 - 1938 that were found in the *Kolping Banner*. Does anyone have a nice snapshot of Gus & Mary Kaiser? If you have or are going to submit your memories, please include a photograph of yourself.
