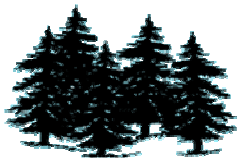

Once again, the Fr. David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$2500.00 grants to children of active Kolping parents. At least one parent must be a member for at least 3 years. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year provided certain conditions are met.
