Our monthly genealogy topic, December 16, will focus on *Civil Records*. We meet on Sunday at 2:00 pm for an hour or so in the Clubhouse. Website:

Civil Records, often also termed Vital Records, complement Church religious records, but are the state or local government agency's records of birth, death, marriage licenses, and marriage records. They are often the simplest way to complete research in our family lines. Many indices and websites carry forms and aids to manage our quests.

Kolping members are urged to attend, learn from each other, and pick up new research skills based on your needs. Our sessions are not just limited to Kolping members; bring a friend.

The first part of the meeting focuses on references and internet research. The next portion of our time will then move from American national and state references to German sites. The rest of our time is spent one-on-one working with each other on capturing our information and expanding our skill sets. Bring a notepad and your research, and a laptop if you have one.

FDH Fund High School Scholarship

Once again, the Fr. David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3,000 grants to children of **active** Kolping parents. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Grants are available for children who will be freshmen at a Greater Cincinnati Catholic high school in the school year 2019-2020. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year, provided certain conditions are met.

In 2019, the grants will be awarded to the two freshman students. Current grant recipients are also required to reapply in order to receive their renewable grants. Applications should be sent directly to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation, who will determine the awardees. The applications are not provided to the members of the FDHF Committee.

Care2Share Fundraiser Took Place on November 10th

For the last seventeen years, Kolping Cincinnati has hosted a fund raising event for the organization Care2Share, a ministry organized by the local Vietnamese community. Its purpose is to provide assistance to the poor and needy in Viet Nam. Care2Share groups also exist in the Carolinas and in Houston.

Annually, dozens of Americans of Vietnamese descent give of their time and talent to go to Vietnam at their own expense to build homes, childcare centers, and sewer systems, as well as to staff medical clinics and provide scholarships to many of the native people. Their activities are often coordinated with a native Franciscan priest.

Many of these volunteers are former "boat people" who fled their homeland in the 1970s at the end of the Vietnam War. They came to America and became citizens, while gaining an education and becoming productive members of their local community.

However, they have not forgotten their homeland, especially the indigenous people who live a rural agrarian life in the mountains. These people have been neglected and receive little or no assistance from the central communist government. They are in need of many of the basic necessities of modern life. In recent years, Care2Share has distributed food, bicycles, and back-to-school supplies, and has built a water filtration system. Learn more at "www.care2share.org".

Care2Share provides hope and spiritual assistance to the needy families in Vietnam. Cincinnati Kolping is gratified to participate in a small way to support this worthy ministry.
