Since 1925, we at Kolping have been part of a great tradition; the crowning of our Schützen König and Königin.

Our Schützenfest is the longest running German festival in the United States and we are blessed to have so many dedicated members step up and give freely of their time and talents to represent our Kolping Society as our Schützen König and Königin.

As with many long running traditions, there are always myths, misunderstandings and misconceptions. The following is a brief outline of the duties and expectations of the Schützen König and Königin. This memo is not to be construed as all encompassing, only as a reference for those interested in shooting for King.

The first and foremost responsibility is to represent Kolping; you are the Goodwill Ambassadors for the Society. You are expected to attend as many Kolping events as possible. Additionally, you should attend the other German societies' events to represent and promote Kolping and our annual events.

The second responsibility is to assemble your court. The court will have a maximum of 40 couples, 5 of which are required: the Kolping president and spouse, the past König and Königin, the new Junior King, the New Junior Queen, and both sets of their parents. The remaining 35 couples should be comprised of your friends and family, with the majority being Kolping members. The selection of your court should not be taken lightly; these are the couples that will help you throughout the year. The court dues are set by the Board and are currently \$220.00 per couple (\$150.00 for the court fees & \$70.00 for the Kings Ball). The court fees (\$6,000.00) are your funds to be used for the court parties (food, alcohol, wine, champagne, music, bartenders' fees, court pins and decorations). All other purchases (King's medals, Trachten, dresses, hats, hotel rooms, etc...) come from your personal funds. Recent Königs have spent as little as \$0.00 to a high of \$5,000.00 over and above the court fees and it is entirely up to your discretion.

The third responsibility is to host and plan the following events: Chairman's Party, Get Acquainted Party, Champagne Party, Parade Rehearsal, Queen's Party and The King's Party. At the King's Ball, you are the guest of the Society, but you are responsible for promoting the Ball and decorating the Hall. Additionally, you will host a cocktail party in the clubhouse for your court and invited guests prior to the Grand Parade.

Your year as König will involve some hard work, but it will also be a rewarding and fun year as you celebrate your reign with the Kolping Society and your friends. If you have any questions, you can call upon the King Fraternity for advice and support.

Schützenfest Planning Committee – Important Upcoming Meetings

Schützenfest Planning Committee Members, Booth Captains, and Leaders –

We need your attendance at our final planning meeting on July 10 in order to be as prepared as possible to properly celebrate our 153rd Anniversary of Schützenfest in Cincinnati!

IMPORTANT: In addition to the final planning meeting outlined below, our Logistics Team will schedule mandatory meetings with some of our Booth Captains, primarily Food Booth Captains, to verify their needs, including food, supplies, equipment, electricity, gas, etc.

- **July 10 MANDATORY: Final Review Meeting for ALL Booth Captains and Festival Leaders**

This critically important final meeting has been held the past few years and is very important to our overall success! We need our Booth Captains and Festival Leaders there to review our 2019 plans and changes and to make sure everyone is on the same page for what we need to do. 2. Back-Two Pins can be used to fit to any soft article of clothing. \$4.00 each.

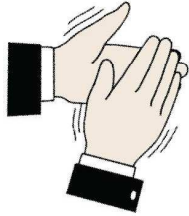

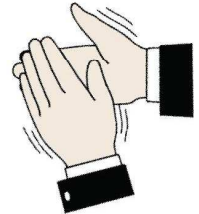
