## Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

On Sunday, April 18, Kolping members were able to celebrate our annual Awards Banquet which recognized long term members and special service awards. The affair combined the honorees for last year and this year. Remember that COVID-19 caused our complete shutdown last March. Now, after 13 months, we can offer some functions with COVID-19 restrictions in place. What a year it has been! Our Kolping family is still strong. It was wonderful to witness our gathering for the Sunday Eucharist and to realize how many members were gathered for the awards presentation. We are not out of the woods, however. We still need to follow all the COVID guidelines and regulations.

I have been thinking about all the hardships that Father Kolping endured. Last month I pointed out some of the ways in which providence led him to grow in living his faith. He certainly followed his vocation as he faced the circumstances and the needs of the people he served as a shepherd of the Lord's flock. As Pope Francis said, "Shepherds should smell like their sheep." By that he was urging pastors to live at the level of their people, not like lords over them. Fr. Kolping certainly filled that description.

Pope Francis' attitude reminds me of an experience I had years ago. I had just attended an ordination of a group of priests. Afterwards, one of my Franciscan brothers asked me if I had seen the part in the ceremony where the bishop broke the arms of the priests. I said what do you mean? My brother Franciscan said that he meant that after ordination many priests seemed to have a different attitude in that they thought they did not have to do any real work. There was an old saying that "priests' hands are made for chalices, not palaces." Pope Francis wants shepherds who smell like their sheep. He is a man after St. Francis' heart.

I remember an incident in my youth when the pastor of our parish scolded his two assistant priests for helping to dig a garden and plant new shrubs and flowers in front of our parish church. I guess that is why I chose to be a Franciscan. St. Francis taught that his brothers should do manual labor to support themselves, no matter their background. When my classmates and I were ordained as deacons, we were assigned to tasks like cleaning the restrooms, caring for the sick, waxing floors, maintaining vehicles, teaching and serving in whatever way each one could.

Our founder, Adolph Kolping, never forgot his humble beginnings. Let's praise and thank the Tuesday Workers at our Kolping Center. And let's thank the Lord for our members who planned, decorated, cooked, and so forth for the very beautiful Awards Banquet and Mass this past Sunday. Alleluia!

**2021 marks the 155<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Schützenfest in Cincinnati!!!** The Kolping Society is truly honored to be celebrating this remarkable milestone of *America's Oldest German Fest - Seit 1866* from July 16 - 18.

The *Schützenfest* Planning Team held our first meeting on April 7. We are without a doubt super excited! To help demonstrate this enthusiasm, we had approximately 40 people attend the meeting. One of our primary conclusions is the common understanding that *less is more*. The general sense is that there is enormous pent-up energy for people to get out and socialize. We feel people simply want to come and enjoy outstanding beer, wine, food, and entertainment.

We must be prudent in where our monies and resources are utilized given the uncertainty of COVID-19's lingering effects. To that end, there will be some *bells and whistles* not offered this year. However, we still have some special new things lined up, including:

- **2 New German Beers to be introduced to America at Schützenfest** – It is a great honor that Die König Ludwig Schloßbrauerei Kaltenberg will introduce their König Ludwig Helles and Weissbier Dunkel in draft form to America at this year's *Schützenfest*! You definitely do not want to miss these special offerings.
- **Entertainment Highlights** – Our fantastic entertainment lineup will be headlined by the combination of the Alpen Echos and Herbert Albinus, who is coming all the way from Disney World. Also, a special highlight this year will be the performance of our Kolping Sängerkhor.
- **New 'Cooling Zones'** – We are adding 3 misting fans to help people stay cool.
- **Additional Tent** – In light of the need to follow the Ohio Department of Health COVID-19's anticipated guidelines and to help people feel comfortable, we are adding an extra tent for everyone to spread out.

The Kolping Society has a wonderful opportunity to have a fantastic event this year and plant the seed for people to come back year after year! We will be hosting one of the first outdoor events in the area after spending too much time indoors.
